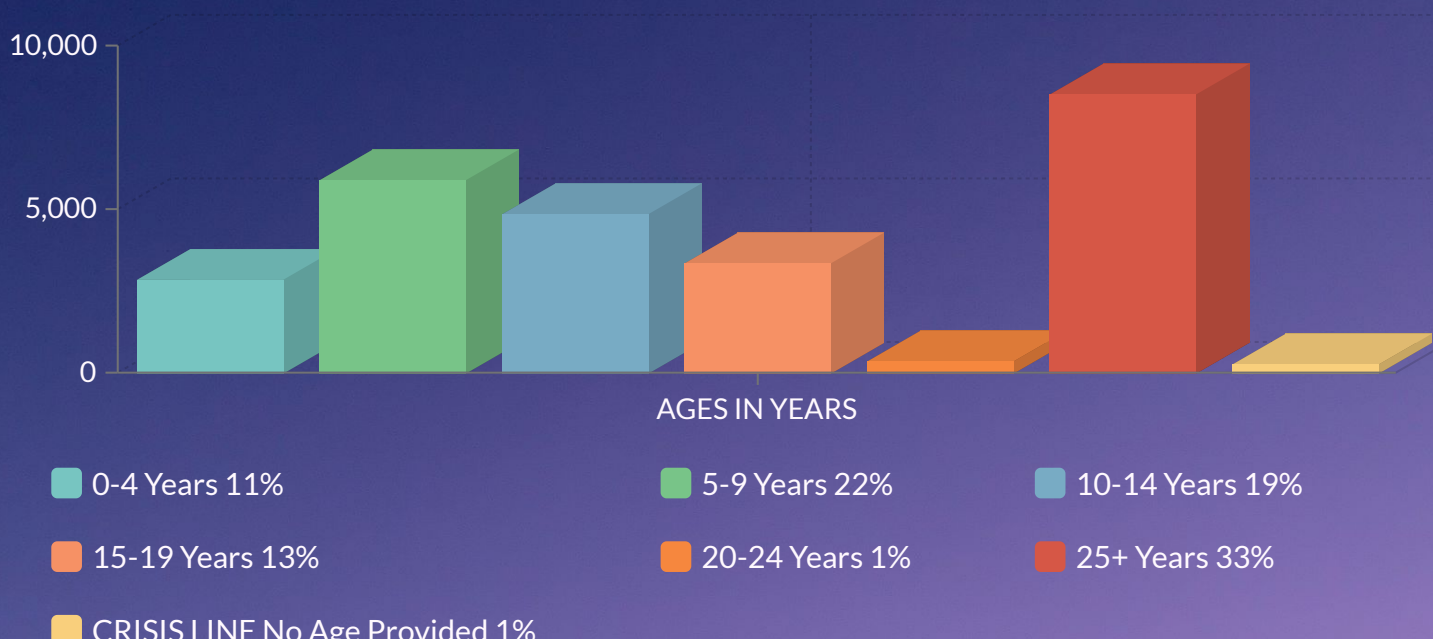

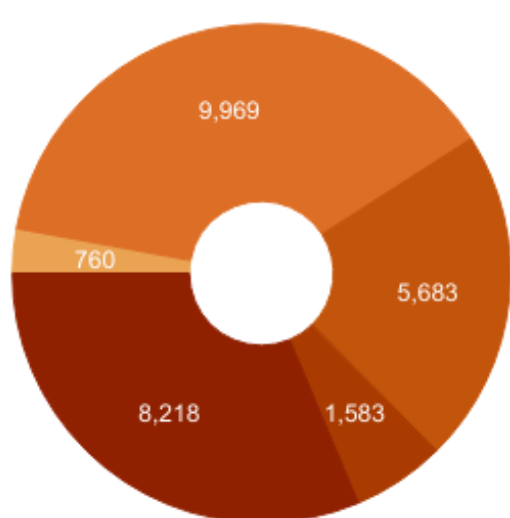

COMMUNITY MEMBERS SERVICED BY EACH SOCIAL SERVICES UNIT

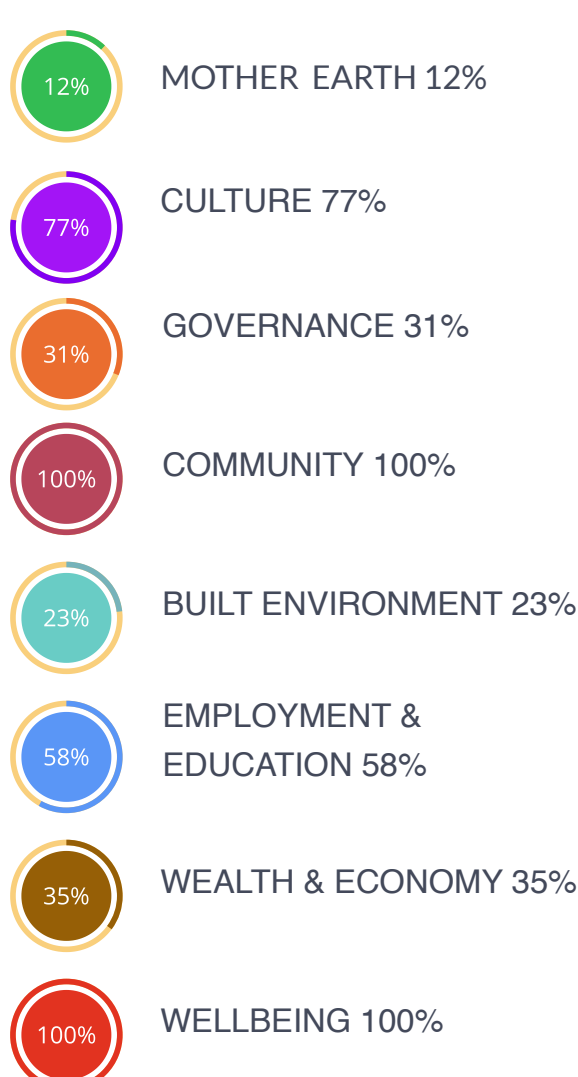

"Our Goal is to Help Families Reunite"

- We help families and our community understand the Child and Family Services Act and how Part IV applies to them.
- To act on behalf of Six Nations of the Grand River Elected Council (SNGREC) children and their families with ALL child and family welfare matters in any location.
- Our role is to guide our families through legal matters and ensure that customary care is the first option for families involved with any child welfare agency.
- We can take part in plan of care meetings for Six Nations children.
- We are available to attend visits either in person or by phone.
- We can take part in alternate dispute resolutions or Family Circles and attend court.

BAND REPRESENTATIVES TRAINING AND PRESENTATIONS

- Presentations of Band Representative role - CAS agencies, hospitals
- Protocol Agreements - CAS agencies, hospitals
- Band Representatives Training - Lateral Violence to Lateral Kindness, Human Trafficking, Child Sexual Behaviour Training
- Cultural Sensitivity Training - Unit provided cultural sensitivity training to all staff of a local off territory CAS which provided their workers (one hundred and forty, 140 employees attended) with a better understanding of our people who reside on and off territory. Training occurred over two separate dates April 28 and May 11 to accommodate the needs of the CAS. This training involved Band Reps utilizing resource people on territory as well as video footage online and engaged participants in craft making. It was anticipated this training would enhance the relationship between the clients and CAS workers - assisting families with accomplishing tasks that will cease societies involvement.



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
